





ENROLLMENT

THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS

- LCS is the Best of Omaha Winner for Best Private Elementary School in 2022 + 2023.
- May marked the completion of our new playground after a year-long wait through supply chain complications and shipping delays.
- Our largest group of 8th graders (26 students, 10 parents, and 3 teachers/staff) participated in the annual trip to Washington DC.
- 59% of our 5th-8th graders participated in band. Our middle school band placed second at the Adventureland Festival of Bands and received all 1's for their performance.
- Our middle school students continue to enjoy competing in athletics such as football, basketball, volleyball, and track & field. The Lifegate/Concordia 8th-grade girls' basketball team qualified for the Lutheran National, a 3-day tournament in Fort Wayne, Indiana, by placing second in the Lutheran State Basketball Tournament. The 8th-grade girls' volleyball team won their regular season and were also the league champions.
- We hosted our first fundraising concert (Celebration) with the band I AM THEY and raised \$93,355 for our school-wide expansion project.
- Our school began a new partnership with uniform vendor Lands' End, implementing a fresh, modern look that aligns with the updated LCS brand guideline.
- Nearly 15% of our total student body received Tuition Assistance: 64 students from 37 families.
- We joined with the Omaha city-wide movement, City Serve, where our entire school blessed the Wycliffe neighborhood and apartments and Zorinsky Lake with cleanup.
- This year's middle school musical was The Music Man and was a great success.
- 400+ grandparents attended our special Grandparent's Day event with coffee, pastries, student performances, and classroom visits. What a beautiful day celebrating the legacy of our students and families.
















MEASURES OF ACADEMIC PROGRESS (MAPS) SCORES



This would allow LCS to serve nearly 50% more students!


We have already added additional classrooms to make room in Kindergarten and First Grade. We are currently working on making more room for Second-Fifth Grade.

Our estimated budget for this expansion is \$1.4M. We are continuing to fundraise for the remaining \$500K and trusting the Lord to provide.

Meet Rajeev Anchan, M.D., Interventional Cardiologist at Bryan Heart in Lincoln, NE.

Rajeev is married to Elisa and is the father of Gus (age 2) and twins, Tom & Lois (8 months). In his spare time, he enjoys sports, cooking, refining his home barista skills, and bird watching with Gus.

We asked Rajeev a few questions about his time at TCS and how it prepared him to be the person he is today. Here's what he said:

"TCS/LCS taught me critical thinking skills and the importance of taking on challenges. I'm reminded daily that at the foundation, my job is a way to love others and glorify the Lord.

The school provided the opportunity to build strong friendships that would continue beyond TCS. It even included getting to know the father of a classmate who would later provide encouragement and mentorship as I went through medical training, faced difficult life circumstances, and made big decisions. Ultimately, TCS provided gospel truths during a formative period with peers and parents that helped me learn how to process failures, forgive others, and realize my need for Jesus.

I think it [not attending TCS] would have changed the friendships I built and choices I made. It likely saved me from making some bad decisions and helped me develop a deeper foundation of what truth is."

Their value was not in just sending me to a great academic school, but in giving me the opportunity to build character, develop Christian values/convictions, and to both learn to serve and lead in society.
