





THIS YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS

- LCS was a Best of Omaha Winner for Best Private Elementary in 2022, 2023 & 2024. Thank you to our teachers and families for making LCS a great experience for so many!
- We completed a new AV system in the cafeteria and use the technology daily for special announcements, meetings, and other important communication pieces.
- We sent our largest group of 8th graders to Washington DC in September: 33 students, 12 parents, and 3 staff members.
- LCS continues to grow. We added an additional section of 2nd grade and 6th grade to accommodate even more students this year.
- Our Celebration fundraising event featured the band Unspoken and raised \$90,847 for our expansion project.
- Our annual Fall Fundraiser brought in \$99,643 and was designated to the school's expansion project as well.
- Our 7th grade "Blue" volleyball team finished in 1st place in the PAL tournament. The 6th grade "Blue" and 7th grade "White" volleyball teams placed 2nd.
- Both of our 6th grade boys basketball teams won their respective leagues. The 7th grade boys basketball team won their tournament. The 8th grade boys earned 2nd place in their tournament.
- Our Track & Field team (in partnership with Concordia) had an excellent season and a handful of LCS students broke school records this spring.














- Tuition assistance is essential for some of our families to begin or remain at LCS. We had 35 families recieve tuition assistance allowing 54 students to attend.
- LCS students participated in our annual city-wide event, City Serve, which included blessing bags for our Wycliffe neighbors, Bingo at Brookstone Meadows Nursing Home, outdoor clean up at Kings Garden Healing Path, serving meals at Open Door Mission, and indoor/outdoor maintenance at Camp Rivercrest.
- LCS had eight students qualify for Wayne State Honor Band and four students qualify for Blair Honor Band this year.
- Grandparent's Day was a great success- thank you to the more than 325 grandparents of our students who participated!
- Our elementary Christmas program was so well attended it resulted in a completely full sanctuary and an overflow area for live streaming.
- We hosted our first holiday themed elementary school dance in December called Jingle & Jive. Fun was had by all!
- Our middle school musical, The Greatest Show, featured the largest cast for a school production in many years.
- Thank you to our amazing PTO Members this year: Christine Gladman, Kristine Houghton, RaeLeigh Larson, Kristine Koch, Grace Wulf, Katy Butler and Reggan Simons, for serving the parents and teachers through prayer, fellowship and fun!








MEASURES OF ACADEMIC PROGRESS (MAPS) SCORES








FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

- Lifegate Christian School views instruction as the most important line item of our budget. 61% of our budget is spent on direct instruction of our students.
- All of our teaching staff have a teaching certification and 63% of them have a master's degree or beyond.
- Since faith-based schools receive little to no federal or state funding, many private schools cannot match the pay of public schools. While our teachers may be able to make more elsewhere, we are so thankful for a staff, who doesn't view their role as a job, but as a ministry.
- In 2022-2023, the average cost to educate a child in the state of Nebraska was \$16,213. In contrast, LCS spends \$8,647.81 per student per year. We work hard and are proud of our team for being able to offer a similar quality education at a lesser cost.
- In 2019, Lifegate Church committed to updating all of their kids spaces (including the school). This space created a more safe and secure space while providing a more conducive learning environment.
- As we continue to grow and expand, we stay committed to building improvements and updates. Some
 of our most recent projects have included branding, a taller and updated fence for our field, and
 remodeled locker rooms.
